TRANSPLANT SELECTION CRITERIA

Every transplant center has a list of criteria to determine your eligibility for a transplant.

UC Health Transplant aims to give all patients the best chance to receive a kidney transplant by giving our due diligence for each patient's evaluation. The criteria listed below are meant as a reference, but we encourage each patient to contact us to be evaluated and tested individually to ensure every patient is given the best opportunity to receive a kidney transplant.

The Transplant Center will not proceed to do a work-up if you have:

- Severe Atherosclerosis
- Severe Dementia/Neurological Deficit
- Limited Life Expectancy

You will have to go through additional tests and screening if you have:

- Severe Limitation
- Lung Disease
- Tobacco Use
- Age
- Cancer
- Hepatitis B
- Non-compliance with Tuberculosis **Medical Treatment**
- Malnutrition
- **BMI Out of Normal Range**
- Physical Disability with
 Active Infection
 - Cardiac Disease
 - Financial Barriers
 - History of Cancer Undocumented Legal Status
 - Cirrohosis Liver Disease
 - **Substance** Abuse

 - Refusal to accept Blood or
 - **Blood Products**

TRANSPLANT CRITERIA FOR LIVING DONORS

Every Transplant Center provides a minimum health standard a potential organ donor must meet to be considered as a living donor candidate.

A Potential Living Donor Candidate Must Be...

- In Good Physical and **Mental Health**
- 18 years of age or older

- Free of the Following:
 - Uncontrolled High **Blood Pressure**
 - Diabetes
 - Cancer
 - Hepatitis B
 - **Organ Disease**
 - Infectious Diseases
 - Significant heart or lung disease
