Smart Storage Tips Use under-used spaces):

- Tuck away: you can use rolling containers for under the bed storage
- Closets: add shelves or hanging organizers
- Behind doors: Try over-thedoor hooks or pocket organizers
- Rolling carts: use for easy access and mobility
- Cover stacks of boxes with waterproof tablecloth and use as your end table
- Stackable storage: think vertically (heaviest on the bottom)
- Use wall shelves or shelving units
